

Easter 2023

Dear friends ~

As we enter this Easter Season, I am thinking about the words we heard on the news every night for a while, with commentators and sports casters celebrating Aaron Judge and his escalating number of home runs in a single season: "All rise!" they would call out. It was a play on his last name {Judge}. I can still remember the delight of Bill Ritter on channel 7, the twinkle in his eyes as he waited each night and then celebrated the appearance on one more home run. Everyone {at least those who love baseball} wanted to be present for the great event; to see history made with their own eyes.

No one got to see the Resurrection. And people were not all that excited, it seems. John, the Gospel from which we will read this year, says Mary of Magdala was rather distressed ~ to her it seemed like the body of her friend and teacher was missing; possibly stolen. She will end up in tears when a figure she does not at first recognize calls her name, and her sorrow becomes the thrill of inexplicable reunion.

All rise! Do not cling to me, Jesus will tell Mary, who doesn't want to lose him again. Go and tell the others, I'm rising up. It's John's way of calling us to let go of what holds us back and get up and follow Jesus' example and not let anything stop us.

All rise! It's what our siblings in Uganda are doing, standing up against that nation's latest draconian measure to criminalize even our existence —10 years in prison for even being LGBTQ+.

It's what the family of Irvo Otieno is doing in the wake of his murder by police and hospital staff. Ten people just piling on him to force the last bit of oxygen from his lungs, smothering him to death. His crime: mental illness. Compelled by the American dream, they say, his family is rising up for equal justice for all God's children.

It's what a man named Yan Rachinsky has tried to do in Russia, founding Memorial, the leading human rights group there, and continuing to speak out despite a government crackdown, naming the injustices, calling for change.

Resurrection is not something we believe happened to someone a long time ago and hopefully will happen to us when we die. It's a way of life. It's about putting the forces of death on notice: The stone has been rolled away and we, as followers of Jesus, are full of a power death cannot contain.

J. Alfred Smith, a preacher, once said ~ "Resurrection is God's protest against those who practice the injustice of crucifixion." The call of Easter is to join the protest! Put the forces of death on notice in this world.

That is what MCCNY does every single day, I believe, in feeding the hungry and sheltering the homeless and supporting the work and ministry of the Global Justice Institute.

John's Jesus lets nobody and nothing turn him around, as the theme we have adopted for 2023 says, and neither should we. Tough times, challenging times, political set-backs are a call to rise up and be the living and life-giving Presence of a loving and sustaining God, as Jesus was.

Don't cling to Jesus; follow him! Jesus is on the rise, and my Easter prayer is that we will be, too.

Join MCCNY for Holy Week and Easter celebrations of the love nothing can contain. All rise!

THE LESSON

MUSICAL RESPONSE MCCNY Choir

La Lección Segunda Mateo 26: 14-29
The Second Lesson Matthew 26: 14-29

Uno de los doce discípulos, la persona que se llamaba Judas Iscariote, fue a ver a los jefes de los sacerdotes y les dijo: "¿Cuánto me quieren dar, y yo les entrego a Jesús?" Ellos le pagaron treinta monedas de plata. Y desde entonces Judas anduvo buscando el momento más oportuno para entregarles a Jesús. El primer día de la fiesta en que se comía el pan sin levadura, los discípulos se acercaron a Jesús y le preguntaron: "¿Dónde quieres que te preparemos la cena de Pascua?" Jesús les contestó: "Vayan a la ciudad, a casa de Fulano, y díganle: 'El Maestro dice: Mi hora está cerca, y voy a tu casa a celebrar la Pascua con mis discípulos.'" Los discípulos hicieron como Jesús les había mandado, y prepararon la cena de Pascua. Cuando llegó la noche, Jesús estaba a la mesa con los doce discípulos; y mientras comían, Jesús les dijo: "Les aseguro que uno de ustedes me va a traicionar." Ellos se pusieron muy tristes, y comenzaron a preguntarle uno tras otro: "Maestro, ¿acaso seré yo?" Jesús les contestó: "Uno que moja el pan en el mismo plato que yo, va a traicionarme. El Niño de la Humanidad ha de recorrer el camino que dicen las Escrituras; pero jay de aquel que lo traiciona! Hubiera sido mejor para la persona no haber nacido." Entonces Judas, la persona que lo estaba traicionando, le preguntó: "Maestro, ¿acaso seré yo?" "Tú lo has dicho," contestó Jesús. Mientras comían, Jesús tomó en sus manos el pan y, habiendo dado gracias a Dios, lo partió y se lo dio a los discípulos, diciendo: "Tomen y coman, esto es mi cuerpo." Luego Jesús tomó en sus manos una copa y, habiendo dado gracias a Dios, se la pasó a ellos, diciendo: "Beban todos ustedes de esta copa, porque esto es mi sangre, con la que se confirma la alianza, sangre que es derramada en favor de muchos para perdón de sus pecados. Pero les digo que no volveré a beber de este producto de la vid, hasta el día en que beba con ustedes el vino nuevo en el reino de Dios."

+ Esta es la Palabra de Dios TE ALABAMOS, O DIOS One of the twelve, who was called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said, "What will you give me if I betray Jesus to you?" They paid Judas thirty pieces of silver. And from that moment he began to look for an opportunity to betray Jesus. On the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Where do you want us to make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?" Jesus said, "Go into the city to a certain person and say to them, 'The Teacher says, My time is near; I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples.'" So the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover meal. When it was evening, Jesus took his place with the twelve disciples, and while they were eating said, "Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me." And they became greatly distressed and began to say to Jesus one after another, "Surely not I, Sovereign?" Jesus answered, "The one who has dipped their hand into the bowl with me will betray me. The Child of Humanity goes as it is written, but woe to that one by whom the Child of Humanity is betrayed! It would have been better for that one not to have been born." Judas, who betrayed Jesus, said, "Surely not I, Rabbi?" Jesus replied, "You have said so." While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it Jesus broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." Then Jesus took a cup, and after giving thanks, gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in God's reign."

2023 MCCNY EASTER OFFERING CAMPAIGN FOR THE GLOBAL JUSTICE INSTITUTE

Dear Friends of the Global Justice Institute:

We hope that this letter finds you preparing to celebrate the joys of the Easter Season and the promise and hope of new life and new possibilities. Despite the continuing global pandemic, we have continued to be very active with partnerships around the world. In Guyana, we are pursuing a new partnership under the direction of The Rev. Dr. Robert Griffin. In Latin America, we are laying the groundwork for an on-site office in that region under the direction of The Rev. Dr. Margarita Sanchez deLeon.

We sponsored our annual Gay Clergy Retreat in Mtito Andei, Kenya, and help refurbish space to house two gay pastors losing their pulpits as they came out. We also sponsored the first Lesbian Couples Retreat in the country. East Africa continues to experience the worst drought it has seen in 40 years, leading political and religious leaders to attempt to refocus the anger and fear of people on the LGBTQI community, diverting attention from the dire needs of those who are suffering. Our work with Rev. Uthasyo, Pastor Robai and in partnership with Stan Kimer continues to be a lifeline and saving grace for many.

In Eastern Europe, our office in Lithuania is firmly established, giving us an on-site location for the region. We continue working to move our allies in Belarus to safer locations. In partnership with Journalists4Tolerance, the Global Justice Institute continues its work of reshaping the social narrative around LGBTQI people. And in Romania, our legal case on behalf of family rights continues to move forward and will be heard by the European Court of Human Rights. Florin Buhuceanu, representing the Global Justice Institute, will also present our case before the United Nations in Geneva.

In the United States, our Government and Policy Team continues its work focusing on legislative efforts, in particular the increase in legislation targeting transgender people.

For years, we have carried on vital and life-saving work with only the direct donations received from individuals and congregations like yours. Your gifts have and will continue to make all the difference in the world.

Jesus went forth with some disciples across the Kidron valley, where there was a garden which they entered. Now Judas, who betrayed Jesus, also knew the place; for they often met there.

So Judas, procuring a band of soldiers and some officers from the religious leaders went to the garden with weapons and lanterns and torches. Then Jesus, knowing all that was to happen, came forward and said,

WHOM DO YOU SEEK?

They answered, "Jesus of Nazareth," and Jesus said to them,

I AM JESUS OF NAZARETH.

Judas, who betrayed Jesus, was standing with them. When he said, "I am Jesus of Nazareth," they drew back and fell to the ground. Again Jesus asked them, "Whom do you seek?" And they said "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus answered,

I TOLD YOU THAT I AM JESUS OF NAZARETH; SO IF YOU SEEK ME. LET THESE OTHERS GO.

This was to fulfill the word Jesus had spoken, "Of those whom thou gavest me, I lost not one." Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's slave and cut off the slave's right ear. Jesus said to Peter,

PUT YOUR SWORD IN ITS SHEATH; SHALL I NOT DRINK THE CUP WHICH GOD HAS GIVEN ME?

So the band of soldiers and their captain and the officers of the religious leaders seized and bound Jesus. First they led him to Annas, the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was the high priest that year. It was Caiaphas who had given counsel that it was expedient that one should die for the many.

Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple. The maid who kept the door said to Peter, "Are you not one of Jesus' disciples?" Peter said, "I am not...."

The high priest then questioned Jesus about his disciples and teaching. Jesus answered,

I HAVE SPOKEN OPENLY TO THE WORLD; I HAVE ALWAYS TAUGHT IN SYNAGOGUES AND IN THE TEMPLE, WHERE EVERYONE COMES TOGETHER; I HAVE SAID NOTHING SECRETLY. WHY DO YOU ASK ME? ASK THOSE WHO HEARD ME, WHAT I SAID TO THEM; THEY KNOW WHAT I SAID.

When Jesus had said this, one of the officers standing nearby struck him, saying, "Is that how you answer the high priest?" Jesus answered,

IF I HAVE SPOKEN WRONGLY, BEAR WITNESS TO THE WRONG; BUT IF I HAVE SPOKEN RIGHTLY, WHY DO YOU STRIKE ME?

Annas then sent Jesus bound to Caiaphas the high priest. Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself by a fire out in the court. Someone said to him, "Are you not one of Jesus' disciples?" Simon Peter denied it and said, "I am not." One of the servants of the high priest, a relative of the servant whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with Jesus?" Peter again denied it; and at once the cock crowed.

Then Jesus was led from the house of Caiaphas to the praetorium. Pilate came out and said, "What accusation do you bring against this Jesus?" Those guarding Jesus answered, "If he were not an evildoer, we would not have handed Jesus over."

Pilate then said to them, "Take Jesus yourselves and judge by your own law." The people said to Pilate, "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death." This was to fulfill the word which Jesus had spoken to show by what death he was to die. Pilate entered the praetorium and called Jesus, and said, "Are you a king—a ruler?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" Pilate answered, "Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me; what have you done?" Jesus answered,

MY REIGN IS NOT OF THIS WORLD; IF MY REIGN WERE OF THIS WORLD, MY SERVANTS WOULD FIGHT, THAT I MIGHT NOT BE HANDED OVER, BUT MY REIGN IS NOT FROM THIS WORLD.

Pilate said, "So you are a Ruler?" Jesus answered,

YOU SAY THAT I AM. FOR THIS I WAS BORN, AND FOR THIS I HAVE COME INTO THE WORLD, TO BEAR WITNESS TO THE TRUTH. EVERYONE WHO IS OF THE TRUTH HEARS MY VOICE.

Pilate responded, "What is truth?", and went out to the crowds again and told them, "I find no crime here. But you have a custom that I should release someone for you at the Passover; will you have me release for you your Ruler?" They cried out, "Not Jesus, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a robber.

Then Pilate had Jesus scourged. And the soldiers plaited a crown of thorns, and put it on Jesus' head, and arrayed Jesus in a purple robe; they came up saying, "Hail O Ruler!" and struck Jesus with their hands.

Then Pilate went out again and said, "See, I am bringing Jesus out to you, that you may know that I find no crime here." So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe.... When the religious leaders and officers saw Jesus, they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate responded, "Take Jesus and crucify him yourselves, for I find no crime here." The people responded, "We have a law and by that law Jesus ought to die, because he has blasphemed."

When Pilate heard this, he was the more afraid; going into the praetorium again Pilate said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave no answer. Pilate then said, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have the power to release you, and power to crucify you?" Jesus answered,

YOU WOULD HAVE NO POWER OVER ME UNLESS IT HAD BEEN GIVEN YOU FROM ABOVE. THEREFORE THE ONE WHO DELIVERED ME TO YOU HAS THE GREATER SIN.

Upon this Pilate sought to release Jesus, but the people cried out, "If you release Jesus, you are not Caesar's friend; anyone who makes himself a ruler sets himself against Caesar." Upon hearing these words, Pilate brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgement seat at a place called The Pavement, and in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover; it was about the sixth hour.

Pilate said, "Behold your Ruler!" the people cried out, "Away with this one, crucify him!" Pilate responded, "Shall I crucify your Ruler?" The religious leaders answered, "We have no ruler but Caesar." Then Pilate handed Jesus over to be crucified.

So Jesus went out bearing his own cross, to a place called The Place of the Skull, which is called in Hebrew Golgotha. There Jesus was crucified, and two others, one on either side...



The soldiers who had crucified Jesus took his garments and divided them among themselves, casting lots for his tunic. This was to fulfill the scripture, "They parted my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots."

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and her sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said, "Woman, behold your child!" Then to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.

After this Jesus, knowing all was now finished, said to fulfill the scripture, "I thirst." A bowl of vinegar stood there; so they put a sponge full of the vinegar on hyssop and held it to his mouth. When Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished," bowed his head and gave up the spirit.

Since it was the day of Preparation, the bodies were removed from the crosses. The soldiers broke the legs of those crucified with Jesus, but when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead they did not break his legs. But one pierced Jesus' side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. The one who saw it has borne witness — this testimony is true, and this witness tells the truth — that you may also believe. For these things took place that the scripture might be fulfilled, "Not a bone shall be broken." And again another scripture says, "They shall look on the one whom they have pierced."

After this Joseph of Arimathea, who was a secret disciple of Jesus, asked Pilate for the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him leave to take it. So Joseph took the body. Nicodemus also, who had at first come to Jesus by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds weight. They took the body of Jesus, and bound it in linen cloths with spices. Now in the place where the crucifixion had taken place, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb. So because of the day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.





+ The Story of God's Covenant with the People of God +

Throughout history, you, loving God, have been faithful to your people.

SPEAKING TO US, NURTURING US, TESTING US, GUIDING US.

Long ago, in a time of great wickedness, when the people had defaced the image of God which they bore, God's heart was grieved. And God set aside the family of Noah and two of every living creature, preserving the righteous. God sent a great flood on the face of the earth, destroying those who had forgotten their promise to the God who gave them life. And God saw what God's judgment had done, and God's heart was broken. Then God said to Noah and those with him:

"BEHOLD, I ESTABLISH MY COVENANT WITH YOU AND YOUR DESCENDANTS; AND WITH EVERY LIVING CREATURE THAT IS WITH YOU, AS MANY AS CAME OUT OF THE ARK. I ESTABLISH MY COVENANT WITH YOU, THAT NEVER AGAIN SHALL THERE BE A FLOOD TO DESTROY THE EARTH. THIS IS THE SIGN OF THE COVENANT WHICH I MAKE BETWEEN ME AND YOU AND EVERY LIVING CREATURE: I SET MY RAINBOW IN THE CLOUDS AND IT SHALL BE A SIGN OF THE COVENANT BETWEEN ME AND THE EARTH."

Long ago, God spoke to Abraham and Sarah, calling them forth from the familiar to the unknown, to leave the country of their childhood, to go into a new land which God had promised. And God said to them:

"I WILL BLESS YOU AND WILL MULTIPLY YOUR DESCENDANTS AS THE STARS OF HEAVEN AND AS THE SAND WHICH IS ON THE SEASHORE; AND BY YOUR DESCENDANTS SHALL ALL THE NATIONS OF THE EARTH BLESS THEMSELVES BECAUSE YOU HAVE OBEYED MY VOICE."

Long ago, when the people of God had been sold into slavery, God called forth witnesses to justice. When the Pharaoh ordered the midwives to slay the Hebrew children, they heard the call of life more strongly than the call of death, and the midwives refused to follow the tyrant's commands. When God called Moses to lead the people out of familiar slavery into unknown freedom, Moses was afraid, but he felt the call of life more strongly than the call of death, and he led the people from bondage. And the people wandered in the desert, not knowing where they were going, but trusting that God would not abandon them. These are the words of the covenant which God commanded Moses to make with the people of Israel:

"FOR THIS COMMANDMENT WHICH I COMMAND YOU THIS DAY IS NOT TOO HARD FOR YOU, NEITHER IS IT FAR OFF. BUT THE WORD IS VERY NEAR YOU. IT IS IN YOUR MOUTH AND IN YOUR HEART, SO THAT YOU CAN DO IT. I CALL HEAVEN AND EARTH TO WITNESS FOR YOU THIS DAY THAT I HAVE SET BEFORE YOU LIFE AND DEATH, BLESSING AND CURSE: THEREFORE, CHOOSE LIFE, THAT YOU MAY DWELL IN THE LAND I PROMISED TO SARAH AND ABRAHAM."

Long ago, God called forth judges and prophets, wise-women and kings, to remind the people of their covenant with God, and of God's loving-kindness. God called Deborah, a mighty warrior, to lead her people in battle against their enemies, and to deliver them from oppression. God called Esther to work for the freedom of her people, to risk her life so that God's people would not be harmed. And when the people turned away, God called Amos to speak the word of justice saying, "I hate, I despise your feasts; but let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever flowing stream." And God did not forget them, even though their sin became great, and God promised once more:

"BEHOLD, THE DAYS ARE COMING WHEN I WILL MAKE A NEW COVENANT WITH YOU, NOT LIKE THE COVENANT WHICH I MADE WITH YOUR ANCESTORS. I WILL PUT MY LAW WITHIN YOU AND I WILL WRITE IT UPON YOUR HEARTS; AND I WILL REMEMBER YOUR SIN NO MORE."

The Lesson
Luke 24: 1-12

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two people in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the two said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? Jesus is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while still in Galilee, that the Child of Humanity must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered Jesus' words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves: then Peter went home, amazed at what had happened.

The First Lesson Acts 10: 34-43

Jesus commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about Jesus that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."
