The First Lesson

Isaías 9: 1-3
Isaiah 9: 1-3

Al principio Dios humilló a Galilea, tierra de Zabulón y de Neftalí, región vecina a los gentiles, que se extiende desde el otro lado del Jordán hasta la orilla del mar; pero después Dios le concedió mucho honor. The Second Lesson

Mateo 4: 12-23
Matthew 4: 12-23

Cuando Jesús oyó que habían metido a Juan en la cárcel, se dirigió a Galilea. Pero Jesús no se quedó en Nazaret, sino que se fue a vivir a Cafarnaúm, a orillas del lago, en la región de las tribus de Zabulón y Neftalí. Esto sucedió para que se cumpliera lo que había escrito el profeta Isaías: “Tierra de Zabulón y de Neftalí, al otro lado del Jordán, a la orilla del mar: Galilea, donde viven los gentiles. El pueblo que andaba en la oscuridad vio una gran luz; una luz ha brillado para los que vivían en sombras de muerte.” Desde entonces Jesús comenzó a proclamar: “Vuélvanse a Dios, porque el reino de los cielos está cerca.” Jesús iba caminando por la orilla del Lago de Galilea, cuando vio a dos hermanos: uno era Simón, también llamado Pedro, y el otro Andrés. Eran pescadores, y estaban echando la red al agua. Jesús les dijo: “Síganme, y yo los haré pescadores de la humanidad.” Al momento dejaron sus redes y se fueron con Jesús. Un poco más adelante, Jesús vio a otros dos hermanos: Santiago y Juan, niños de Zebedeo, que estaban con su padre en una barca arreglando las redes. Jesús los llamó, y en seguida ellos dejaron la barca y a su padre, y se fueron de Jesús. Jesús recorría toda Galilea, enseñando en la sinagoga de cada lugar. Anunciaba la buena noticia del reino y curaba a la gente de todas sus enfermedades y dolencias.

TE ALABAMOS, O DIOS

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. Jesus left Nazareth and made a home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the gentiles—the people who sat without light have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the reign of heaven has come near." As Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two siblings, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishers. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people." Immediately they left their nets and followed Jesus. As Jesus went from there, he saw two other siblings, James child of Zebedee and his sibling John, in the boat with their parent Zebedee, mending their nets, and Jesus called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed Jesus. Jesus went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the reign and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.




CONGREGATIONAL MEETING!

WHAT TO DO IF ICE COMES TO YOUR DOOR



DO NOT OPEN DOORS

ICE cannot come in without a signed warrant by a criminal court judge. They can only come in if you let them.



REMAIN SILENT

ICE can use anything you say against you in your immigration case so claim your right to remain silent!

*Say "I plead the fifth amendment and choose to remain silent".



DO NOT SIGN

Don't sign anything ICE gives you without talking to an attorney.



REPORT & RECORD!

Report immediately: UWD hotline 1-844-363-1423.

Take pictures & video unless you're on federal government property.

Take notes of badge numbers, number of agents, time, type of car and exactly what happened!



FIGHT BACK!

Get a trustworthy attorney & explore all options to fight your case. If detained, you may be able to get bail - don't give up hope! Join your local team to defend yourself from enforcement!

Know Your Power Record and Report:



Step 1 - Ensure Audio and recording is on and ready to be used and linked to a cloud.

Step 2 - Get information of the officer's, name, badge and agency.

Step 3 - Narrate the date, time and location of event.

Step 4 - Do not disclose the information of your loved ones or yourself to the agents.

Step 5 - Report it to the **MigraWatch** Hotline and send your video/pics to migrawatch@unitedwedream.org

Always remember you have the power to make choices, you have a choice over your safety, how you respond and what you choose to share.
