The First Lesson

Isaiah 58: 6-10

¿Acaso no es este el tipo de ayuno que me, agrada—dice Dios—romper las cadenas injustas, desatar las correas del yugo, dejar en libertad a los oprimidos y romper todo yugo, compartir tu pan con el hambriento y recibas en tu casa al pobre sin techo; en que vistas la persona que no tiene ropa y no dejes de socorrer a tus semejantes. AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

2026 National Theme: *"A Century of Black History Commemoration"*

2026 marks the 100th anniversary since Dr. Carter G. Woodson established the first commemoration of "Negro History Week." This year we celebrate the resilience, achievements, and influence of African Americans on American History.



Maria W. Stewart (1803 – 1879) was the first African American woman to speak before a mixed audience publicly. She wrote for *The Liberator*, making the case for the abolition of enslavement and for women's rights long before it was safe or popular to do so.



Sarah Mapps Douglass (1806 – 1882) co-founded the Philadelphia Female Anti-Slavery Society, and together with Grace Douglass, her mother, and Lucretia Mott, helped center black women in the abolitionist movement.



Sarah Forten (1814 – 1893), along with her mother, Charlotte, and sisters, Margaretta and Harriet, laid the foundation for generations of black womanist activism by organizing fairs, circulating petitions, and supporting people who escaped enslavement.
